

Fund performance summary

The S&P/ASX Small Ordinaries Accumulation Index returned +1.56% for the month. The fund outperformed the market and delivered a +1.63% return over the month.

Contributors

Bingo Industries Ltd (BIN)

Strong profit guidance issued at Annual General Meeting.

Summerset Group Holdings Ltd (SNZ)

Rebound in sales in September quarter. Improving NZ housing market.

Technology One Limited (TNE)

Strong financial year 2019 (FY19) result. Accelerating switch to cloud.

Detractors

Fisher & Paykel Healthcare Corporation Limited (FPH)

Not held by the fund. Very strong first half FY20 result.

Lynas Corporation (LYC)

Weak commodity prices.

Perenti Global Ltd (PRN)

Armed attack near mine in Bukina Fasso. Force majeure situation.

Market overview

The S&P/ASX Small Ordinaries Index (XSO) increased by 1.56% during November 2019. The Small Industrials increased by 2.84%, while the Small Resources decreased by 3.72%. XSO finished the month on a forecast price-to-earnings ratio of 18.8x which is 21% above its 5 year average. This valuation is 7% higher than the equivalent ratio for the ASX200.

The best performing sectors were: IT Services, (+17.0%), Building Materials (+14.3%), IT Products (6.5%), Wholesale & Manufacturing (+6.0%) and Steel (+5.8%). The worst performing sectors during October were Chemicals (-16.4%), Other Metals (-10.7%), Automotive (-8.5%) and Base Metals (-7.7%).

The best performing stocks within the XSO Index were NRW (NWH, +33%), Sundance Energy (SEA, +27%), Technology One (TNE, +26%) and Audinate (AD8, +22%). NWH announced a highly accretive capital raising and acquisition of BGC. Tech One announced a better than expected FY19 result.

The worst performing stocks in the XSO index were New Century (NCZ, -34%), G8 Education (GEM, -24%) and ioneer (ION, -22%). G8 Education disclosed worse than expected occupancy and earnings outlook.

Market outlook

The key global macro drivers facing Australian and NZ small companies continue to be the impact of the ongoing trade dispute between The US and China and the significant bond market rally. It is unclear at this stage whether these macro factors will result in a significant Chinese fiscal stimulus package that will be positive for resources or a significant slow down that will be negative. The Australian Government seems determined to maintain at least a balanced FY20 budget so increased spending this year at least seems unlikely.

Resources and their related mining services suppliers are also dependent on the US\$/A\$ exchange rate. The A\$ is around US0.68c and has been at this level for some time.

Housing related stocks in Australia continue to strengthen on the back of ever more positive house prices and auction results with Sydney and Melbourne in particular experiencing significant house price rises. Despite this rebound and recent cuts in interest rates, the Australian consumer remains cautious. ABS data reveal that retail sales growth is sluggish with the most recent monthly data missing analysts forecasts. It appears that central bank stimulus has not offset the negative impact of high household debt and low wage growth.
